Scotland's favourite pint. Cold. Lager.

Bear Face: Drygate Brewery, Glasgow (500ml bottle, 4.4% ABV) £3.95
Hopped lager. Clean, crisp, citrus. Refreshingly vigorous.

Caesar Augustus: Williams Bros. Brewery, Alloa (500ml bottle, 4.1% ABV) £3.95
For the indecisive. Lager meets IPA. Bright, hoppy and happy. Fit for an emperor.

Franz Lager: Stewart's Brewery, Edinburgh (330ml can, 4.0% ABV) £3.95
Cool, crisp and fresh. Saaz and Cascade hops deliver a bitter-sweet sensation. Seriously good lager.

Schiehallion: Harviestoun, Alva (330ml bottle, 4.8% ABV) £3.50
A modern classic for the thirsty Scots. A pinnacle of craft lager/. Climb it and be invigorated.

Sexy summer golden ale. Light as a feather and softened by lovely infused elderflower.

Pale, gold standard brew. Nutty. Zesty orange aroma. First Gold and Cascade hops.

Bitter and Twisted: Harviestoun, Alva (330ml bottle, 4.2% ABV) £3.50
Refreshingly lively blonde beer with a tingly, lemony finish. She will make your night.

Arran Blonde: Arran Brewery, Isle of Arran (330ml bottle, 5.0% ABV) £3.95

Substance with zest. Natural. A blonde bombshell.

Black Isle Organic Blonde: Black Isle Brewery, Black Isle (330ml bottle, 4.5% ABV) £3.95

A light biscuity blonde style beer loaded with New Zealand Organic Hallertau Aroma hops.

Pale Ales

Lightness: Loch Ness Brewery, Drumnadrochit (500ml bottle, 3.8% ABV) £4.95

Delicate, fruity session pale ale. Straw gold in color, apple and zesty citrus aromas, leading to a fresh, bitter tangerine ending. Fit for a thirsty monster, made for you!

A clash of two brewing styles: The spice and earthy base of a Belgian saison meets New World Hops. You have never tasted a saison quite like this.

Rich red, brewery conditioned. Fruity, toffee malt character. Citrusy hop aroma. Drool.

A soaring amber ale with a perfect balance of citrus and malt. Weighty, deep, and amiable.

Five malts, berry and caramel riding alongside marmalade and chocolate. A new Classic.

Scotch, Brown, Dark Ales & "Other"

- Alba:** Williams Bros., Alloa (330ml bottle, 7.5% ABV) £3.95
This is the Highlands in a bottle. A "Triple" style ale, brewed until the end of the 19th Century, is spiced with Spring harvested sprigs of spruce and pine. Rich, tawny, and best enjoyed at room temp.
- Wilderness Brown Ale:** Loch Ness Brewery, Drumnadrochit (500ml bottle, 4.4% ABV) £4.95
Ruby red, wheat, amber, and chocolate malts. "Fruits of the forest" aroma. Cocoa & oats aftertaste.
- St. Giles Scotch Ale:** Stewart's Brewing, Edinburgh (330ml bottle, 5.0% ABV) £3.50
Traditional Scottish malts mashed up with US Cascade hops. Coffee, chocolate and smiles.
- Dark Island:** Orkney Brewery, Orkney Islands, (500ml bottle, 4.1% ABV) £4.50
Iconic flagship ale, ripe fruit, dark chocolate, figs, nuts... Rich roasted malts...
A storm in a bottle.
- Old Engine Oil:** Harviestoun, Alva (330ml bottle, 6.0% ABV) £3.95
Go on and oil your engine... thick, dark, chocolatey viscosity... smooth and moreish. Vroom.

Stout

- Darkness:** Loch Ness Brewery, Drumnadrochit (500ml bottle, 4.5% ABV) £4.95
Full stout, chocolate malt and roast barley. Creamy head with aromas of espresso and black cherry
- Dark Skies:** Drygate Brewery, Glasgow (330ml can, 5.0% ABV) £3.95
Bold American Stout. Dark fruit hop bitterness, chocolate, espresso, and licorice hints. Seriously good.

Deeside Stout: Deeside Brewery, Banchory, Aberdeen-shire (330ml bottle, 5.0% ABV) £4.25

Milk chocolate stout. Like a milkshake. But, it's not. It's beer. And it's velvety smooth.

March of the Penguins: Williams Bros., Alloa (500ml bottle, 4.9% ABV) £3.95

Creamy, super-smooth milk stout. Malty start, hoppy middle, lingering sweet orange aftertaste.

Black Gold: Cairngorm Brewery, Aviemore (500ml bottle, 4.4% ABV) £5.25

Scottish oil for the body and the mind (without the greenhouse effect.) Smooth, nutty, sweet, and dry.

Porter

Midnight Sun: Williams Bros., Alloa (500ml bottle, 4.9% ABV) £4.25

Malted and roast barley, oats, chocolate malt, a handful of hops and a wee bit of fresh root ginger.

Black Isle Organic Porter: Black Isle Brewery, Black Isle (330ml bottle, 4.6% ABV) £3.95

Worthy of the "black" isle, rich and full, coffee and chocolate malts, light hops, and lots of love.

Cider

Thistly Cross Traditional: Thistly Cross, Dunbar (330ml bottle, 4.4% ABV) £4.50

Summer session cider comprised of Scottish apples. Seriously awesome. Go on, you've earned it!

Single Malt Whiskies

Highlands

Aberlour (10 year): Aberlour (35ml measure, 40% ABV) £4.25

Colour: Golden amber with a slight reddish hue

Nose: Sweet and full. Sherried raisins, hints of toffee, and a pleasant nuttiness

Taste: Quite full-bodied, spicy rich fruitcake, toffee notes and a creamy malty-feel and the vaguest whisper of something akin to synthetic banana

Finish: Caramel and honey, the malt still evident and the sweet spices still linger

Aberlour (12 year): Aberlour (35ml measure, 40% ABV) £4.75

Colour: Golden amber with hints of ruby

Nose: Soft and rounded with fruity notes no red apple

Taste: A fine sherried character, balanced with rich chocolate, toffee, cinnamon, and ginger spices

Finish: Warming and lingering - sweet and slightly spicy

The Ardmore: Kennethmont, Aberdeenshire (35ml measure, 40% ABV) £4.00

Colour: Light golden

Nose: Heather Honey with hints of cinnamon and toffee bonbon.

Taste: Creamy vanilla spice gives way to more overt smoky charcoal notes, especially with the addition of water. Smoke doesn't dominate and is balanced by the sweet honey and spice flavours.

Finish: Full bodied, silky mouth feel with a dry, tangy and lingering aftertaste, coupled with delicious spice notes.

Dalmore (12 year): Alness, (35ml measure, 40% ABV) £5.50

Colour: Rich amber

Nose: A warm coffee house in Seattle; roasting beans, the oily nuttiness in a fine espresso, there are little notes of malt and cereal and butter from the pastry counter with rich orange from the fruit bowl on the counter.

Taste: Notes of Seville marmalade and triple sec with winter spices and fruitcake. Zesty cocoa and milk chocolate.

Finish: Medium, oranges

Glenmorangie (10 year): Coy Tain, Ross-shire (35ml measure, 40% ABV) £4.25

Colour: Yellow gold

Nose: A rich nose, flower and spicy hints with some vanilla wood notes

Taste: The taste confirms the nose, delicate honey wood taste with a subtle hint of nuttiness

Finish: Smooth and relatively long

Old Pulteney (12 year): Wick (35ml measure, 40% ABV) £4.25

Colour: Deep amber, red golden (with a slight pink hue) sparkling with a copper glow

Nose: Medium to high intensity with a briny hint of sea air

Taste: Dry, medium, and smooth, redolent of honey and cream, faintly salty with a slight spicy note

Finish: Sweet and long-lasting

Tomatin Legacy (10 year): Tomatin (35ml measure, 43% ABV) £4.25

Colour: Pale gold

Nose: Lemon, panetella, and pine forest. Slightly green with vanilla.

Taste: Light and sweet with sweet barley and pine needles, grass, sweet honey candies, toffee, fruitcake, vanilla, white chocolate, oak, lemon, nuts, cinnamon, pepper

Finish: Smooth and relatively long

Tomatin (12 year): Tomatin (35ml measure, 43% ABV) £4.75

Colour: Amber gold

Nose: Fruit and spices with green apple, cinnamon, nutmeg and lavender. Pretty green and grassy like being inside a fresh forest.

Taste: honey, Milk Chocolate, oranges, and lemon zest and some caramel and sherry. Very pleasant and mild, not much of a burn, a good amount of sweetness, but not much to the complexity.

Finish: Short with sherry, rye, and fresh cut grass.

Islands

Highland Park (12 year): Kirkwall, Orkney (35ml measure, 40% ABV) £4.50

Colour: Glowing amber.

Nose: Heather-honey sweetness; peaty smokiness

Taste: Rounded smoky sweetness; full malt delivery

Finish: Teasing, heathery, delicious

Jura Origin (10 year): Isle of Jura (35ml measure, 43% ABV) £4.25

Colour: Light golden, yellow.

Nose: Light clean and fresh, with a hint sea salt. Almonds, and spice notes.

Taste: Light peaty notes, with fruit and spicy overtones.

Finish: Sweet, peaty.

Jura Superstition: Isle of Jura (35ml measure, 43% ABV) £4.75

Colour: Golden with an amber tint

Nose: Light delicate phenolic aromas, with strong honey, spice, and cinnamon overtones

Taste: Add a little water and the delicate peat smoke will fill your mouth, mixed with the honey and spices

Finish: Long lasting balanced finish

Jura Prophecy: Isle of Jura (35ml measure, 43% ABV) £6.50

Colour: Golden with an amber tint

Nose: Some peat, aniseed, fry, pungent, oily

Taste: Smoky and dry, a muscular, powerful Jura with notes of nutmeg, cardamom and sea spray

Finish: Good length, with punch, dry peat smoke and herbal notes

Ledaig (10 year): Tobermory, Isle of Mull (35ml measure, 46.3% ABV) £4.75

Colour: Delicate lemon yellow

Nose: Quite light and well balanced. There is a very soft peat with a gentle smoke. Notes of barley and malt extract with walnut and pine oil and a hint of iodine with notes of dried fruits and nuts.

Taste: Medium-bodied and quite rich. There are notes of spice and smoke gathering above the charred oak. The peat is quiet and dry with a touch of black pepper and earth.

Finish: Medium-length and slightly smoky with spice.

Talisker (10 year): Isle of Skye (35ml measure, 45.8% ABV) £4.75

Colour: Beautiful amber.

Nose: Thick pungent smoke. Notes of kipper, seaweed, apple peels. Fresh and fragrant.

Taste: Full bodied with huge plumes of smoke and volcanic, peppery peat. Intense.

Finish: Long finish, barley, malt.

Talisker Skye: Isle of Skye (35ml measure, 45.8% ABV) £4.75

Colour: Bright autumnal gold

Nose: Sweet stuff, toffees and vanilla ice cream up front, almost grain-like. Becomes increasingly honeyed. There's a little coastal influence here too, just hints of sweet Caol Ila perhaps, with very restrained smoke

Taste: Honeyed toasted oak, sappy wood, only a little pepper and smoke, apple turnovers and hints of lemon and lime Opal Fruits. Fennel seeds

Finish: Drying and slightly less sweet, hints of spice and smoke

Talisker Storm: Isle of Skye (35ml measure, 45.8% ABV) £5.00

Colour: Bright autumnal gold

Nose: Initial brine, but not as abrupt as the 10 Year Old, quite creamy by comparison. Banana. Banana angel delight? Window putty, hint of sticking plasters and barbecues, citrus. White pepper develops towards the bottom of the glass.

Taste: Thick and mouth-coating with wood smoke, brine, some tin and chilli heat too.

Finish: Red chilli peppers and oak dryness with a hint of embers.

Islay

Bunnahabhain (12 year): Islay (35ml measure, 46.3% ABV) £5.00

Colour: Deep gold

Nose: Full, refined and rich with oily peat hints, toffee, liquorice and flowers

Taste: Rather intense but still sweet with some peat hints, a rather rustic but still delicate taste

Finish: A pleasant long full finish, coming back on ripe fruit and honey

Laphroaig (10 Year): Islay (35ml measure, 40% ABV) £4.75

Colour: Full sparkling gold

Nose: Huge smoke, seaweedy, "medicinal," with a hint of sweetness.

Taste: Surprising sweetness with hints of salt and layers of peatiness.

Finish: Lingering.

Laphroaig Select: Islay (35ml measure, 40% ABV) £4.00

Colour: Sparkling gold

Nose: Classic, medicinal peat notes up front, supported by citrus-y, chocolaty sweet notes and soft barley

Taste: The peat is there, but it's taking it easy and letting the bright notes of lemon, green apples and mint stand out. Darker baking spice notes develop further on

Finish: Medium length, peat remaining in sight until it's over

Speyside

The Balvenie Doublewood (12 year): Dufftown (35ml measure, 40% ABV) £5.00

Colour: Honey caramel

Nose: Gristy, supple nuttiness intertwined with spices. Honeyed sultanas and grapes. Hugely inviting.

Taste: Sweet with good body. The bourbon characters; gentle spice with a little vanilla, a hint of balancing peat lurking quietly in substrata. Dried fruit, too, combining with nuts, nutmeg, cinnamon, back into the bourbon notes – so well integrated.

Finish: Spicy, slightly drying, still sweet.

Glenfiddich (12 year): Dufftown (35ml measure, 40% ABV) £4.25

Colour: Golden

Nose: Fresh and fragrant, touch of pear

Taste: Distinctive, well-balanced flavour of rich fruit, subtle pine and a hint of peatiness

Finish: Satisfyingly long, lingering and rounded and smooth aftertaste

Glenfiddich IPA: Dufftown (35ml measure, 43% ABV) £6.50

Colour: Rich Golden

Nose: An elegant harmony of fresh green apple, William's pear and spring blossom. Complimented with aromatic hops and fresh herbs.

Taste: Vibrant with a zesty citrus note followed by creamy vanilla and a hint of fresh hops.

Finish: Enduring sweetness with an echo of green hops.

The Glenlivet Founder's Reserve: Banffshire (35ml measure, 40% ABV) £4.25

Colour: Some dates then what at first appears to be a touch of salinity, but it is better described as a slightly sharp plum and apricot wine note. There's orange zest, toffee, hints of struck match and chocolate raisins, but before this starts to sound "Sherried," there's also pear drops, a dusting of sweet cinnamon, honeysuckle and sweet pea

Nose: Fruity, then sweet, more toffee, a touch of anise, then into milk chocolate Flakes, banoffee pie and apple turnovers

Taste: Subtle peatiness. Delicate. Slightly sweet and fruity, with vanilla notes. Clean and well-balanced

Finish: Creamy toffee to the fore now, a little oak and sweet barley sugar warmth, too. Milk chocolate raisins linger

Glen Moray: Elgin (35ml measure, 40% ABV) £3.00

Colour: Mid-golden

Nose: Sweet, fruity and floral. Highland toffee and candy floss with honeycomb and sweet malt notes

Taste: Butterscotch candies, golden barley and a touch of cinnamon. The port cask influence comes through with light notes of raisins and freshly picked red berries

Finish: Rather long, with honey, vanilla and a dusting of cocoa

Glen Moray Port Cask: Elgin (35ml measure, 40% ABV) £3.50

Colour: distinct pink hue

Nose: Creamy vanilla at the fore, joined by jammy red currants and blackberry. Toasted oak.

Taste: Smooth, warming and rounded with a good firm body. Lots of sweet, soft malty flavours evolve in the centre of the palate, surrounded by toffee and mouth watering fruits

Finish: Toffee, blackcurrants and a hint of liquorice remains into the finish which is medium in length

The Singleton of Auchroisk (12 year): Dufftown, Banffshire (35ml measure, 40% ABV) £4.25

Colour: Amber

Nose: Smooth, sweet, sherry and malty. Slight hint of peat

Taste: Taste confirms the nose, sherry, malty and a hint of peat

Finish: Average length

Lowlands

Auchentoshan American Oak: Lowlands (35ml measure, 40%ABV) £4.00

Colour: Bright gold

Nose: Bourbon vanilla and coconut layers of zesty citrus fruit

Taste: Refreshingly smooth yet lively with vanilla cream, coconut, and white peach

Finish: Crisp with sugared grapefruit and a hint of spice

Auchentoshan (12 year): Lowlands (35ml measure, 40%ABV) £4.75

Colour: Bright gold

Nose: Tannins, a little sweet barley

Taste: Refreshingly smooth yet lively with vanilla cream, coconut, and white peach

Finish: Dry and very long, a little sweetness from the barley

Bubbly

Prosecco: Beletti, Italy (11% ABV)

bottle £16.00

Soft and fruity, peach and pear, breezy apple peel and lemon zest. Go on, celebrate.

White

Sauvignon Blanc: Jackson Estate Green Lip, Marlborough, NZ (13% ABV)

glass £4.00 / bottle £14.00

Fresh cut grass and garden pea aroma lead into a palate of guava and passion fruit with undertones of gooseberry and citrus.

Chardonnay: Alvier, D.O. Valle Central, Chile (13% ABV)

glass £4.00 / bottle £14.00

Tropical fruit aromas, think pineapple and banana as well as floral notes. Young, fresh, fruity and balanced.

Rosé

Cuvee La Cloche, Languedoc Rousillon, France (12% ABV)

glass £4.00 / bottle £14.00

Light and delicate, salmon pink in colour, lovely summer fruits, refreshing finish.

Red

Merlot: Torreon de Paredes, Valle de Rengo, Chile (13.5% ABV)

glass £4.00 / bottle £14.00

Aromas of ripe red fruits, plums, cherries with fine notes of herbs, tobacco and sweet chocolate. In the palate, the attack is warm with notes of red fruits and pepper.

Tempranillo: / Bobal, Toro Loco, Valencia, Spain (12.5% ABV)

glass £4.00 / bottle £14.00

Full bodied and full of life. A blend of Bobal and Tempranillo grapes. Just right.

Shiraz Viognier: The Pitmaster, Southeastern Australia (14% ABV)

glass £4.00 / bottle £14.00

The lore of Aussie BBQ reveals aromatic tales of summer berry fruits and spices. Generous mulberry fruit balanced by spicy character. Good weight and length.
